Air Mauritius improves operations to Germany and Switzerland. Substantial increase in capacity from October 2011 to March 2012

Air Mauritius today announced a major improvement to its Germany and Switzerland operations with a delinking of the Frankfurt/Geneva service into dedicated Frankfurt and Geneva non-stop services from October 2011 to March 2012. The delinking of the services will provide non-stop flights to both Frankfurt and Geneva during the whole peak season from October 2011 to March 2012.

The annual capacity on Frankfurt now increases by 19% from 20,115 to 23,840 seats. For Geneva, the capacity increases by 10% from 21,605 to 23,840 seats. The capacity growth is more pronounced during the peak winter months where capacity to Frankfurt increases by 28% and to Geneva by 24% compared to the previous winter season.

Indradev Buton, EVP Strategic Planning and Donald Payen, EVP Commercial and Communications announcing the improvements today stated *"We are delighted to announce these major improvements for our customers ahead of ITB in Berlin this week. This decision has also been taken after customer feedback and consultation with our tourism and travel trade partners. We will now have a robust product offering in Germany during winter with nonstop services to Frankfurt on Fridays and to Munich on Wednesdays. We will also offer nonstop Saturday departure to Geneva. These nonstop services, together with our twice daily connections via Paris from these three cities, will provide our customers and partners with more choices, more flexibility and therefore more opportunities."*
