

LIQUIDS, AEROSOLS AND GELS (LAGs)

For security reasons, most airports apply restrictions to the carriage of LAGs in the aircraft cabin. Please consider the following when packing your baggage :

What is considered Liquid, Aerosol and Gel (LAG)?

Besides obvious LAGs, the security measures also apply to the following:

Food in sauces	Shaving foam & other foams
Creams & lotions	Pastes, including toothpaste
Perfumes & Sprays	Mascara & Lipstick
Gels, including hair & shower gels	Jam & honey

The Requirements

- All liquids should be carried in containers with a capacity not greater than 100 ml (or 100g).
- Liquids carried in containers larger than 100 ml will not be accepted, even if the container is only partly filled.
- Containers should be placed in a transparent re-sealable plastic bag (approx 20 X 20cm) of a capacity not exceeding one litre
- The containers must fit comfortably within the plastic bag.

Example of packed LAGs



- The passenger will be asked to present the plastic bag separate from his/her cabin baggage for visual examination at the hand baggage screening point.
- Only one transparent plastic bag is permitted per passenger. Infants and children are also allowed one.

Exemptions

- Medication essential for the journey.
- Baby milk/food when baby is traveling.
- Special dietary requirements

We would recommend that passengers carry all supporting documents like prescription, medical certificate, etc.

Duty Free LAGs

Most airports allow the purchase of LAGs in the duty free after the hand baggage screening point or under special conditions.

Transfer passengers

For passenger with onward connections or travelling on multi-sector flights to reach their final destination and having to disembark at intermediate airports (*for example on flight Mauritius – Perth – Melbourne where passenger destined for Melbourne needs to disembark/re-embark at Perth airport*), we recommend to purchase duty-free at the last airport of departure or on-board their last flight.

As there are security checks, please note that all liquids, aerosols and gels over the 100 ml limit (including duty free items) will NOT be allowed as hand luggage through transit at Perth and will be confiscated by the authorities.
